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### 2023 VJKF Program

We were finally back on campus for our 2023 VJKF Program, and we were more than thrilled to book students' flights, see them roll up their sleeves and get involved in all the labs planned.

This year's programs were held throughout May at The University of British Columbia, the University of Ottawa, the University of 1 Calgary, First Nations University of Canada, University of Manitoba.

105 Indigenous students graduated from our 2023 VJKF Program with the help of our university partner deans, professors, mentors, graduate students, coordinators, and other volunteers. Seeing students learning again on campus was amazing, and we've already started planning for next year.



A HUGE congratulations to Maximus Barten and Samantha Gillis for receiving this year's SHAD Scholarships.




#### Susan O'Brien Memorial Scholarship

Susan O'Brien was a shy, intelligent, yet athletic youth with a passion for basketball. After high school, she attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where she completed her degree in science.

In 2008, Susan and her husband, Ron Woznow, co-founded The Family Food Research Foundation, a registered charity with the mandate to help Indigenous youth from across Canada pursue a post-secondary degree. The Family Food Research Foundation was later renamed the Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation and shifted its focus to introduce Indigenous students to Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) programs at universities. In her volunteer role as foundation administrator from 2009 to 2020, she facilitated 550 students' attendance at 10 different universities. Her commitment to the Foundation and our students was relentless and she worked tirelessly to ensure the safety and care of all participants.

Sadly, on January 18, 2022, Susan passed away suddenly. To commemorate Susan's hard work and dedication to the Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation, our Foundation awarded a \$1,500 scholarship to Nydia Goosehead this year. Congratulations Nydia!



REMEMBERING TONY WILLIAMS

It's with great sadness that we announce the passing of our long-time Chair of the Verna J. Kirkness Education Foundation (VJKF) Board of Directors, Tony Williams. Surrounded by family, he passed away peacefully on June 27, 2023, in Okotoks, AB.

Before retiring, Tony provided actuarial and investment consultation for First Nation Settlement Trusts and other trust funds. During his retirement, he devoted much of his free time to volunteering and philanthropic work. In 2022, Tony was presented an Eagle Feather in recognition of his work with VJKF and Indigenous communities, and was gifted the name Necetenmnin, meaning "Leader."

Tony had a passion for promoting higher education and established several bursaries at the University of Manitoba to support Indigenous students enrolled in science programs. He was a member of U of M Alumni Council, the Dean of Science's External Advisory Board, and a member of the Wawatay Advisory Board (a program supporting emerging Indigenous students).

We will be forever grateful for Tony's dedication to our organization and his friendship. He led the Foundation through our growth years, through the COVID years, and now through the rebirth. Both wise and kind, and dear to us all. His presence will be deeply missed at our board meetings.
